TREASURER'S REPORT Treasurer Carl Goodwin stated there will be a finance meeting on Thursday, October 25 at 9 a.m. The new auditors started October 15 and we are pleased with them. Carl stated to please see page 3 of the report, it sums up what we have been talking about in finance meetings. Also requested reports are in the packets.

BUDGET OFFICE Carrie Cravens, Budget Director reiterated the points Carl made.

CODES Codes Administrator Robert Craig stated that 2 more residences are getting ready to be tore down. We invoiced 31 yards for mowing today. Animal control has 17 cats and 10 dogs. We are going to have to suspend voluntary surrenders until we get more space. We have collected \$500 in impound fees these last few weeks and received a \$200 donation today.

PUBLIC WORKS Bill Sizemore, Chairman of the Public Works Committee thanked the company for bringing the automated trash service truck for demo today.

Tom Somers, Public Works Director stated Clark Trail from Park Lane to City limits will be resurfaced beginning tomorrow.

PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT Marilyn Ruppel, Chairman of the Public Improvement Committee had nothing to report.

PUBLIC SAFETY Quinn Laird, Police Chief bragged on the investigators for their recovery of the guitar and items taken from OLMC. The police department and 911 board will be at pumpkins in the park.

Shawn Priddy, Fire Chief stated the chili dinner is November 10 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tickets are \$7. Carryouts available. Alderman York thanked them for their quick work at a fire at Campbell's last week.

David Shoemake, Chairman of the Public Safety Committee had nothing to report.

FINANCE Motion was made by Alderman York, seconded by Alderman Shoemake to authorize bills to be paid before the Council. Alderman York, Crompton, Kinley, Miller, Ruppel, Sizemore, Shoemake and Ahlgren voted "Yea". None voted "Nay".

INSURANCE Sheila Ahlgren, Chairman of the Insurance Committee had nothing to report.

LIBRARY Marilyn Ruppel, Liaison for the Herrin City Library stated the library was open 24 days in September. There were an average of 160 items checked out per day, OPAC used 711 times and there are now 5,692 registered borrowers. Friday, October 19 at 2 p.m. will be a program "Escape from Marion: Garrett Trapnell Story".

CIVIC CENTER Scott Kinley, Liaison for the Herrin Civic Center reminded everyone about the Queen of Hearts Raffle on Tuesday nights at 8 p.m. The prize is at \$2,700 at the present time. COUNCIL Alderman Ruppel stated residential trick or treating will be on Halloween.


Alderman Miller has had phone calls regarding hunting in the city limits.
